#### **NAPA, ASU, AGS & NAC Host Summit on Transportation Infrastructure Investment: *“Building a Shared Map of the Nation’s Infrastructure to Enable Smart Investments”***

WASHINGTON, D.C. – The National Academy of Public Administration, Arizona State University, the American Geographical Society and the National Academy of Construction are joining forces to hold a special summit on May 1, “Building a Shared Map of the Nation’s Infrastructure to Enable Smart Investments.” This event will explore strategies for providing decision makers with the systematic, comparable location-based information they need to assess and prioritize transportation and other infrastructure investments.

In its 2017 report card on American infrastructure, the American Society of Civil Engineers issued an overall grade of D+ and estimated that \$4.6 trillion was needed to address it. This is a staggering sum that begs the question of priorities, but priority setting is hindered by the lack of systematic, comparable location-based information available to decision makers on the nation’s infrastructure assets and their condition. However, innovative efforts across the country offer precedents and tools for organizing the needed information across jurisdictions and integrating it effectively into infrastructure investment decisions.

The summit will bring together leaders in public administration, infrastructure development, geography, geographic information systems, and data integration/open data at Arizona State University’s (ASU) Tempe campus. Invitees in the Washington, DC area can participate remotely in the first portion of the event via videoconference at ASU’s Washington Center.
