National Academy of Public Administration Inducts 50 Leaders in Public Administration as New Fellows at Annual Fall Meeting

WASHINGTON, DC -- The National Academy of Public Administration (the Academy) today inducted 50 leaders in the field of public administration as new Academy Fellows during its annual Fall Meeting in Washington.

Blair. “Fellows are nationally recognized for their significant contributions to the field of public administration and today’s incoming class exemplifies this commitment to public administration. Selection of the Academy’s new Fellows follows a rigorous review of the individual’s contributions to the field of public administration and policy. A Fellows Nominating Committee, selected by the Academy’s Board Chair, makes its recommendations to the full Fellowship, which then votes on those individuals nominated to be a Fellow. The Committee was chaired by Reginald Robinson, an Academy Fellow and the Director and Professor of the School of Public Affairs and Administration at the University of Kansas.
